Which EXC Tours Are Right for You?

Choose the tours that interest you by using the icons as a general guide to the level of activity involved, and select the tours best suited to your physical capabilities. These icons will help you to interpret this brochure.



Easy Activity: Very light activity including short distances to walk; may include some steps.



Moderate Activity: Requires intermittent effort throughout, including walking medium distances over uneven surfaces and/or steps.



Strenuous Activity: Requires active participation, walking long distances over uneven and steep terrain or on steps. In certain instances, paddling or other non-walking activity is required and guests must be able to participate without discomfort or difficulty breathing.



Panoramic Tours: Specially designed for guests who enjoy a slower pace, these tours offer sightseeing mainly from the transportation vehicle, with few or no stops, and no mandatory disembarkation from the vehicle during the tour. As vehicles outside the United States are rarely lift-equipped and ramps are seldom available, a very small amount of walking will be necessary. The pace is gentle and taking your time is encouraged.



Limited Capacity: The number of people able to participate in this tour is strictly limited. Reasons for limiting capacity may include the number of transportation seats available, or the need to maintain a safe ratio of guides for hikes, fishing and water activities. Tours require a minimum number of participants in order to operate.



Meal: This tour includes a meal—lunch on daytime tours, or dinner on evening tours.



Snack: This tour includes a small snack or tasting of local specialties. The snack is not a meal.



Guests Using a Wheelchair or Other Mobility Aid Device

I have a disability. How do I know which tours will best suit me?

The tours are graded according to the relative level of activity they entail. The activity icons that appear at the beginning of each tour description provide a general idea of the level of activity to expect. Please see page 2 for specific information or speak to an EXC Tours specialist (1.888.425.9376). It is important to keep in mind that tour operators are subject to the laws of their own country with respect to accommodating the needs of guests with disabilities. In most foreign countries, the laws are not as stringent as those in the United States.

Will I encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship when it's in port?

Please see the on-board EXC Desk to help determine whether you can expect to encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship in a particular port of call. The decision whether or not to carry or provide other mobility assistance to a guest and their device (wheelchair, walker, etc.) up or down a ship's gangway, or on or off a tender boat, is at the sole discretion of the Captain, made based on his evaluation of guest and crew safety. We encourage you to bring a collapsible wheelchair as space limitations may restrict the ability of some tour operators to accommodate motorized mobility aid devices.

Frequently Asked Questions

What should I wear?

Comfortable walking shoes are recommended for all EXC Tours™. When you visit places of worship, we recommend dressing conservatively (no shorts or sleeveless tops), but casual clothing is perfectly acceptable. Dress in layers and have a jacket along. Bring an umbrella or raincoat, a hat and sunscreen.

What about meals?

Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. In-room dining is available on board.

How will I know what time each tour departs?

The onboard EXC Tours Order Form in your stateroom will show departure times. This information will also be printed on your EXC Tours tickets, which you will receive on board. Approximate tour departure times are posted on our website at hollandamerica.com.

I am traveling with friends. Can we be accommodated on the same motorcoach?

The departure location for each tour is printed on

your EXC Tours tickets. If you wish to travel with friends, please arrive at the designated meeting place together. This will enable the staff to allocate space for you on the same vehicle.

To allow our EXC Tours managers flexibility to coordinate your time in port with meals and activities on the ship, exact departure times are published in the EXC Tours Order Form on board. 

Disembarking the Ship

Port Arthur, Australia - Sunday, January 6, 2019:

Daytime Ghost Tour

Are you brave enough to participate in a ghost tour that will take you into the totally spooky and creepy side of this historic site? Join a walking tour with a specialist guide as your small group uncovers a tale of unexplained events from Port Arthur's past, – strange happenings that baffled and alarmed convicts, free people and soldiers alike. Some areas of the site have a certain element of mystery and intrigue, with stories, sightings and tales of ghosts and other phenomena. As you wander into some of the areas that are not normally accessed by the public your guide will relay some of these creepy encounters that may make the hairs on the back of your neck stand up!

One of the highlights is sure to be the exclusive access to the Senior Surgeon's basement, where he carried out medical research and dissection. This building is not open to the general public during the day, but you will be one of the few who are lucky (or unlucky) enough to enter this space.

Are there ghosts? Truth or myth? Either way today is your chance to decide for yourself!

Please note this is a walking tour that will travel at a moderate pace and is suitable for those free from mobility concerns that can walk over a variety of surfaces including steps. Due to the content of this tour it is not recommended for young children or the faint

of heart!

Devil Tracker Eco Tour

Join a unique "behind the scenes" daytime tour into the secret world of wild Tasmanian devils to learn about the battle to save the last isolated population of healthy devils on Earth. After a short trip in a specially equipped Land Rover the expert guide will take you on a short bushland walk to demonstrate how they are using infra-red night-time cameras to monitor the local devils and other wildlife.

Then it is back to the Devil Tracker Station to check the images captured on camera to see what the local wild devils have been up to during the previous night. You will see how they identify each wild devil, find out what they have been eating, whether or not it is a healthy specimen and when it is breeding.

This fascinating project is critical in the vital battle to save the Tasmanian devil species which is under threat from a strange fatal disease. Fortunately the devils living in the forests of the isolated Tasman Peninsula are all healthy and the ultimate aim is to maintain the whole of the region as a disease-free sanctuary. Your Devil Tracker Eco-Tour includes a visit to the devils and other endemic animals in the Devil Unzoo.

Guards and Gaolers Walking Tour

Join a site guide on a walking tour and journey with a small group to the most iconic buildings that housed the Administrators of the settlement and visiting dignitaries. Whilst life for the prisoners at Port Arthur was unimaginably tough there is another side to the story. Port Arthur was of course home to many "free men" who ran the daily operations of the site. Today is an opportunity to witness what life was like from their perspective in comparison to the conditions of the convicts they guarded. Your specialty guide will take guests on a walking tour to uncover this unique tale.

Venture into the Commandant's House, the Visiting Magistrate's House and the Junior Medical Officer's House. Hear about some of the notable figures from Port Arthur's past, and get an insight into what life was like for the free men and women who lived at Port Arthur.

Please note this is a walking tour that will travel at a moderate pace and is suitable for those free from mobility concerns that can walk over a variety of surfaces including steps.

Norfolk Bay & Coal Mines

You will walk through the spectacular ruins of the Coal Mines Historic Site, world heritage listed 2010. Return to Port Arthur for morning tea and participate in a guided tour of the convict ruins, then enjoy some free time to further explore the site or take the short harbour cruise before returning to the ship. Your guide for the tour is a student of history, who is also a local historian and naturalist.

Port Arthur - Behind The Scenes

This exclusive experience includes a fascinating 'behind the scenes' walking tour of the Port Arthur Historic Site, one of Australia's Convict World Heritage Sites.

See the magnificent Government Gardens, gain insight into how archaeology, science

and horticulture have assisted in recreating the magnificent 19th Century pleasure garden. From there, move to the collection processing laboratory and see objects rediscovered by archaeologists after having spent over a century buried amongst the ruins of the site. You will also be able to see some of the more interesting historic collection items.

Finally your guide will take you to the famous Separate Prison, one of the more recent and large scale conservation projects, where you will talk with heritage experts involved in bringing this ruined building back to life. You will also be able to see where convicts were locked in single cells for 23 hours each day. Here they ate, slept and worked with just one hour a day allowed for exercise, alone, in a high walled yard. After the tour, enjoy time to visit any of the 30 historic buildings and ruins, comb through the Site's unique Gift Shop for souvenirs, or just wander and explore this unique World Heritage Site.

Tasman Food & Wine

Proclaimed as one of "The 10 Coolest Places To Visit In 2015" by Forbes Magazine for its "stunning landscapes" and "home grown food culture," Tasmania's delights never cease to amaze. Discover the wonders for yourself with an all-day excursion that begins with the pleasantries of a genteel tea, continues to the quiet splendor of a landscape forged over millions of years, and ends with a sweet treat.

Your tour begins as soon as you board the coach for the drive to the Port Arthur Lavender Farm. Sit back and relax as your coach meanders along the Tasman Peninsula, which wows with stunning ocean views and densely forested areas full of thick green trees.

Once you arrive at the lavender farm you'll sit down for an enjoyable morning tea of scones served with lavender cream and serene coastal views. After a stroll around the farm to see the distillery feel free to wander through the gift shop filled with lavender goodies.

Renowned as a foodie's paradise, Tasmania is famous for its freshly shucked local oysters and award winning wines. So next on the day's menu is a visit to the Bangor Wine & Oyster Shed, which sits on the site of Abel Tasman's landing in 1642.

Perched above the town of Dunalley overlooking Blackman Bay, the vineyard is one of the most southerly in the world—and one of the newest. The five-year-old Bangor Wine, like many wineries in the region, learned what European migrants discovered 165 years ago: Tasmania's mild temperatures during spring and summer followed by warm autumn days and cool nights could yield excellent wines.

Enjoy the fresh air and learn about the winery's history as you feast on a tasting platter of freshly shucked local oysters accompanied by a glass of wine. After the tasting session a fresh and tasty lunch is

served.

Once you've completed your epicurean delights, you'll rejoin your coach for a photo stop at Eaglehawk Neck, the narrow isthmus that connects the Tasman Peninsula to the mainland. Have your camera ready for the monumental rock formations that punctuate the landscape of Tasman National Park. Devil's Kitchen, Tasman Arch and The Blowhole are just three of the mesmerizing natural geological wonders created by the wind and waves over the span of countless eons.

Photos taken, you'll climb back aboard your coach and continue on to Port Arthur. En route, you'll stop for a sweet treat of ice cream and fresh berries (Optional – guests own expense) before reaching the pier.

Tasman Island Eco-Cruise

Take Robert Pennicott's award-winning three-hour **coastal wilderness cruise** along the spectacular coastline between Eaglehawk Neck and Port Arthur. You will see Australia's highest sea cliffs, enter deep sea caves and join in the search for abundant sea and coastal wildlife such as seals, dolphins and sea birds.

The custom-built boat is ideal for viewing the spectacular coastline and wildlife with covered open-air seating providing an excellent all-round view and connection with the environment.

One of the highlights of the cruise is Tasman Island -- a great landmark of the Southern Ocean. Its slender white lighthouse is still a beacon for seafarers entering Storm Bay, including during the famous annual Sydney-to-Hobart Yacht Race. Few places on Earth boast such a rich variety of marine wildlife and seabirds. The Continental Shelf runs close to Tasman Island and an upwelling of nutrients from the ocean's depths creates a buffet for all the creatures in the complex food chain of the sea, from plankton and birdlife -- such as albatross -- to sharks, dolphins and southern right whales.

Tasman Peninsula Discovery

The fascination of the convict era, together with the dramatic coastal scenery of Tasmania, comes to life with this opportunity to discover the scenic Tasman Peninsula and view some of the extraordinary geological features of this area.

Departing by luxury coach, you will travel over the forested peninsula to **Eaglehawk Neck** -- a thin isthmus that separates the peninsula from the rest of Tasmania. Stop here for a short **walk** to view the Port Arthur Historic Site's Tessellated Pavement, the Officers' Quarters and the Dog Line, where savage dogs once guarded the isthmus to

prevent convicts escaping from Port Arthur.

At the **Pirates Bay Lookout** you will take in some spectacular views of the stunning coastline with its beautiful beaches of white sands, blue water and rugged rocky cliffs.

Next, visit some of the more unusual features of the peninsula. At the **blow hole**, a weak spot in the rock has eroded to the very top layer, so that when the waves build up pressure they spray the water through the hole, similar to a whale's spout, only stronger.

The **Devil's Kitchen and the Tasman Arch** (you will visit one or the other; not both) are both natural rock formations that are located high above the ocean on top of rugged cliffs. These geological features are nature's marvels, whose softer layers of rock have been eroded by the waves, leaving the stronger top layers withstanding the forces of nature.

Following this exploration of some of the unique features of the Tasman Peninsula, you will return to the ship at Port Arthur.

Tasman Peninsula, Lavender Farm & Wine Tasting

Start this engaging half-day tour by boarding your motorcoach to enjoy a picturesque drive along the Tasman Peninsula, which wows with stunning ocean views and densely forested areas full of thick green trees.

A short distance away is the Port Arthur

lavender Farm. Looking out over long bay the setting is very picturesque. Enjoy a morning tea of sweet scones served with Lavender cream, fresh tea or coffee then enjoy a wander around the property and distillery. Taste the unique flavour of lavender chocolate and fudge.

Continue past lush farmland and quaint towns to reach Pirates' Bay Lookout, a magnificent vantage point renowned for featuring some of Australia's most dazzling tableaux. Taking in the scene, snap pictures of the Tasman Peninsula's dreamlike curves, cliffs and colors, glistening Pirates' Bay and glorious beach and coastal views that seem to extend to infinity.

Moving on, delight in a wine tasting from Bream Creek, an award-winning winery, accompanied by savory biscuits and cheese. Established in 1973, Bream Creek is one of Tasmania's oldest wineries.

As the journey continues, travel to Eaglehawk Neck, the slender isthmus connecting the Tasman Peninsula with mainland Tasmania. The singular way out of Port Arthur Penal Colony, this long, narrow neck was heavily patrolled from 1830-1877 by guards and ferocious dogs, part of a strict security system designed to prevent convicts from escaping. Explore the old officers' barracks and wander along the famous dog line, then marvel at the flat expanse of "tiled" rock known as the Tessellated Pavement, which looks manmade but is in fact a rare result of erosion. Then, with the incredible imagery, history and taste sensations from this wonderful journey in mind, enjoy an idyllic drive back to ship.

Tasmanian Devil Unzoo

Don't miss this visit to the **Tasmanian Devil Unzoo**—a chance to encounter a pint-size marsupial with a super-sized attitude. Endemic to Australia, the Tasmanian Devil is both entertaining and horrifying to watch. At feeding time, snarling and snapping, they crush up bones and fight among themselves for the last shred of food. They are meat-eating marsupials, now found only on the island of Tasmania, although they once roamed widely across Australia. You'll also have time to catch the **sea eagle show**. See raptors fly and watch the dive of the falcon in the **Kings of the Wind** outdoor free-flight presentation. **Hand-feed kangaroos**, walk among friendly wallabies or take a wildlife walk to see eagles and rare hawks. The park is dedicated to wildlife protection and rescue, and also boasts extensive breeding programs.

Hobart, Tasmania, Australia - Monday, January 7, 2019:

Art & Wine in Tasmania: In Partnership with Food & Wine Magazine

Every visit to **Tasmania** should include drinking world-class Riesling and seeing amazing art. Thankfully, you can do both today.

Visit Tasmania's **Museum of Old & New Art** (MONA). This is Australia's largest privately-owned gallery and museum. You'll kick off your experience here exploring the subterranean galleries at your leisure. MONA showcases the diverse contemporary collection of its owner -- Tasmanian mogul David Walsh. On display you'll find everything from Egyptian funerary objects, to artworks by Damien Hirst, to a machine that mimics the human digestive system. As you wander, you'll form your own opinions about the much-loved installations as well as those that were designed to be provocative and downright controversial.

Next, head to the **Moorilla Winery**, perched on the banks of the River Derwent. When Claudio Alcorso planted the first vines at Moorilla in 1958, the Department of Agriculture said it was a "rubbish" idea, as apples and pears were the crop of the day. But Alcorso did it anyway, and the rest is history. Today, Moorilla is one of Tasmania's most forward-thinking and entrepreneurial wineries. Take a guided tour of Tasmania's second-oldest vineyard and the gravity-

assisted winery. Set in the shadow of Mount Wellington's majestic snowcap, Moorilla is widely recognized for its stand-out Pinot Noirs, Rieslings and Chardonnays. It has a hip side, too -- Elvis Costello and the Violent Femmes have played concerts amid the estate's vines. Your tastebuds will go wild as you sample Moorilla's wines at the cellar door or underground in the barrel room. The amazing wines are enhanced by a long ripening process leading to a great flavor complexity. It's a complexity that is matched by the beauty of the location and the art you'll see along the journey.

Notes:

Wear comfortable walking shoes. Bring a hat; wear sunscreen. Bring local currency, as many vendors do not accept credit cards or US dollars. Not advisable for guests with mobility limitations. Corkage policy: Wine purchased on this tour is exempt from the on-board corkage fee (offer limited to one bottle of wine per person).

Best of Hobart & Historic Shene

Discover the hidden gems of Hobart.

Travel via Hobart's northern suburbs to **Bonorong Wildlife Sanctuary**. Here you will find koalas, Tasmanian devils and wombats, kangaroos and wallabie. Enjoy **free time** to wander about at your own pace as you observe and interact with the animals.

Next, visit the historic **Shene Estate**. From the moment you enter the carriageway leading to Shene you are taken back in time. Explore the heritage component of a still-working 4,500-acre Black Angus cattle and sheep farm. Its colorful past has direct links with King George III and Governor Lachlan Macquarie

Enjoy a **snack** of sandwiches, homemade cakes and tea.

Re-board your motorcoach and continue to historical **Richmond**. You'll have **free time** on your own to explore the old jail and many of the well-preserved buildings that have been converted into shops, galleries, cafés and bed-and-breakfast lodgings.

A local **vineyard** is calling your name for a **wine-tasting session** at the cellar door. Meet the friendly team whose passion is growing some the region's finest wines.

En route back to the pier, the **Rosny Point Lookout** offers a panoramic view of Hobart and Mt Wellington.
