## ➤ frequently asked questions



### what should i wear?

Comfortable walking shoes are recommended for all shore excursions. When you visit places of worship, we recommend dressing conservatively (no shorts or sleeveless tops), but casual clothing is perfectly acceptable. Dress in layers and have a jacket along. Bring an umbrella or raincoat, a hat and sunscreen.

### what about meals?

Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. In-room dining is available on board.

### how will i know what time each tour departs?

The on-board Shore Excursions Order Form in your stateroom will show departure times. This information will also be printed on your shore excursion tickets, which you will receive on board. Approximate tour departure times are posted on our website at [www.hollandamerica.com](http://www.hollandamerica.com).

### i have a disability. how do i know which tours will best suit me? will i have a problem (dis)embarking the ship?

Guests with disabilities should inquire in advance whether a shore excursion will be able to accommodate their needs. We have graded the Shore Excursions according to the relative level of activity they entail. The walking icons that appear at the beginning of each tour description provide a general idea of the level of activity to expect. Please refer to the "How to Choose Your Tours" section in this brochure for specific information on the walking icons. It is important to keep in mind that shore excursion operators are subject to the laws of their own country including with respect to accommodating the needs of guests with disabilities. In most foreign countries, the laws are not as stringent as those in the United States. Please speak with the Shore Excursions Office as to whether you can expect to encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship in a particular port of call. In this regard, the decision whether or not to carry or provide other mobility assistance to a guest and their mobility assistance device (wheelchair, walker, etc.) up or down a ship's gangway, or on or off a tender boat, is at the sole discretion of the Captain,

made based on his evaluation of guest and crew safety. We encourage you to bring a collapsible wheelchair as space limitations may restrict the ability of some tour operators to accommodate motorized mobility aid devices.

### i am traveling with friends and we would like to be on the same motor coach

The departure location for each shore excursion is printed on your shore excursion tickets. If you wish to travel with friends, please arrive at the designated meeting place together. This will enable the staff to allocate space for you on the same vehicle.

### tour durations

The individual tour descriptions include approximate durations. To allow our Shore Excursions Managers flexibility to coordinate your time in port with meals and activities on the ship, exact departure times are published in the Shore Excursions Order Form on board. For more information, please attend the Shore Excursions Presentation or visit the Shore Excursions Office.

Remember, online shore excursion reservations are processed prior to any requests made on board the ship and receive priority handling.

general information for booking online

At the time of making your reservations online, we will advise you whether or not your reservations are confirmed or whether you have been waitlisted. Your credit card will be charged immediately for all confirmed reservations. Should space become available for a waitlisted shore excursion request, we will e-mail or otherwise contact you at that time and either immediately charge your credit card if you have already given us your credit card information or ask you to provide us with that information for immediate charge processing. Shore excursion reservations are subject to cancellation by us at any time prior to the credit card charge being accepted by your bank. If you or Holland America cancel a tour more than 3 days prior to cruise departure, we will issue a credit on the credit card that you used to pay for the reservation. For any cancellation within 3 days of departure, a credit will not be given on your credit card. Instead, we will apply an ONBOARD CREDIT ONLY policy under which the refund (less any cancellation fee) will show up as a credit to the shipboard account of the person who was to take the shore excursion. If the credit is not fully utilized during the cruise, the balance will be paid to that guest by the ship's Purser.

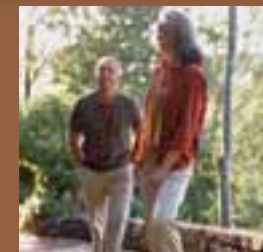

➤ **how to choose your tours**



Choose your shore excursions by using these icons as a general guide to the level of activity involved, and select the shore excursions best suited to your physical capabilities.

-  **easy activity:** Very light activity including short distances to walk; may include some steps.
-  **moderate activity:** Requires intermittent effort throughout, including walking medium distances over uneven surfaces and/or steps.
-  **strenuous activity:** Requires active participation, walking long distances over uneven and steep terrain or on steps. In certain instances, paddling or other non-walking activity is required and guests must be able to participate without discomfort or difficulty breathing.
-  **panoramic:** Specially designed for guests who enjoy a slower pace, these excursions offer sightseeing mainly from the transportation vehicle, with few or no stops, and no mandatory disembarkation during the tour. As vehicles outside the USA are rarely lift-equipped and ramps are seldom available, a very small amount of walking will be necessary. The pace will be gentle and taking your time is encouraged.
-  **limited capacity:** The number of people able to participate in this tour is strictly limited. Reasons for limiting capacity may include the number of transportation seats available, or to maintain a safe ratio of guides for hikes, fishing and water activities. Tours require a minimum number of participants to operate.
-  **meal:** This tour includes a meal—lunch on daytime tours, or dinner on evening tours.
-  **snack:** This tour includes a small snack or tasting of local specialties. The snack is not a meal.

**also included:** The cost includes the service of a driver and English-speaking guide, unlimited mileage, road tolls, parking fees and bottled water.

**not included (unless otherwise noted):** Guests' entrance fees for attractions are not included in the price due to the wide range of attraction possibilities, uncertain number of attractions to be visited, and varying number of guests participating. We strongly

recommend that you bring some local currency to cover such costs as credit cards are not readily accepted in some ports. Lunch will not be included on any tour as many guests prefer to select their own dining venue.

**itinerary planning:** If you need help planning your personal itinerary, the Port Lecturer and/or Shore Excursions Manager can assist you and will gladly answer your questions. This can be very helpful in many destinations where travel time, location, holidays, and opening hours of attractions need to be taken into consideration in order to maximize the efficiency of your time ashore.

On board the ship, you will be given a form to advise the Shore Excursions Office of the itinerary you have chosen.

**booking on board:** The Signature Collection may be available for booking once you are on the ship, but this cannot be guaranteed. Please check with the Shore Excursions Office on board.

## Bermuda Island Tour

This comprehensive tour covers the entire length of the island of Bermuda and includes views of the island's famous pink sand beaches stretching impressively along the Southern Shore, including Horseshoe Bay and Church Bay. You will also view Bermuda's impeccably manicured Botanical Gardens, located just outside the busy city of Hamilton. As your tour takes you along the North Shore, you will pass through quaint Flatts Village, built around the picturesque inlet with a unique old-world charm. On the South Shore, stop at another famous landmark, Gibbs Hill Lighthouse. Enjoy some of the most scenic views in all of Bermuda, and take advantage of this great spot for photos. Your tour continues to the West End of the island, across the smallest drawbridge in the world, and into the Royal Naval Dockyard. Your driver/guide will point out a number of attractions here, where you'll have time to explore on your own.

## Best of Bermuda Home & Highlights Cruise

Seek out some fun and a little indulgence right in the heart of the most historic and beautiful area of Bermuda. Board the Coral Sea to experience the Bermuda's homes and highlights. This information-filled tour is about the Bermuda story—how it began, how it survived, and how it evolved into one of the most successful economies anywhere in the world. This tour also features magnificent homes, beautiful beaches and many original 17th-century fortifications. Bermuda's 137 islands can only properly be seen by boat and your captain and crew are knowledgeable and courteous. The Coral Sea is a comfortable and spacious 60-foot motor cruiser, featuring an enclosed main deck and an easily accessible open upper deck that is 60% shaded. Soft drinks, beer, wine and mixed drinks are available from the full-service bar and a beverage of your choice is included. The vessel is equipped with rest rooms.

## Coral Sea's Water Tour

Sightseeing, turtles, glass-bottom boat reef viewing, water sports and swimming are all part of this fun-filled tour. You'll travel aboard the Coral Sea—a comfortable and spacious 60-foot motor cruiser with an enclosed main deck and an open upper deck

that is 60% shaded. The boat is equipped with two rest rooms and a cash bar. You'll visit a natural turtle habitat and view the outer reef through a 200-square-foot glass-bottom viewing window. A host of 17th-century fortifications line the beaches and bays, with picturesque homes and hideaways thrown in. The captain explains the ins-and-outs of this breathtaking Bermuda scenery with thoughtful and insightful commentary. On the eastern corner of the Bermuda island chain, you'll anchor at Ferry Point Park—a lovely cove with a small beach. The calm waters of the cove are studded with coral reefs and surrounded by parkland. This area, called Whale Bay, makes a picture-perfect venue for kayaking, snorkeling and swimming. Challenge yourself with snorkeling or kayaking with full instruction and safety equipment provided, or simply relax and swim with noodles and water toys, also provided.

Please note: Wear your swimsuit under your clothing; bring a towel, sunscreen and a hat. Guests with heart problems, epilepsy, diabetes or asthma are not allowed to participate. Waiver must be signed and medical conditions disclosed.

## Eco Glass Bottom Kayak Safari

A kayak excursion will be a highlight of your stay in Bermuda, and glass-bottom kayaks are a fantastic way to view the beautiful underwater world of corals and fish. You'll be able to see the ocean floor while feeling safe and secure—these special kayaks are extremely stable and easy to handle. You will be instructed on how to kayak; then, board your kayak from the beach in waist-deep water. The group will then paddle along beautiful shoreline made up of lagoons and fascinating rock formations at a relaxed pace for approximately one hour. Along the way, watch for herons and Bermuda longtails, depending on the season. As you paddle, often the water is calm and clear enough to see colorful coral reef formations and fish. View Bermuda's forts dating back to the 1600s, and your Bermudian guide will provide you with information all about the island's endemic flora, history and marine eco-system. The tour ends with a choice of a cooling swim or relaxing on the boat.

Please note: Bottled water, snorkel gear and life vest are provided. The tour will visit the best site based on the weather conditions of the day. Kayaks are two-seaters; combined weight limit is 400 lbs. Tour is two hours in duration with 45 minutes (±) of kayaking. Children 12 years and under must be accompanied by an able-bodied adult in the same kayak. Wear your swimsuit; bring a towel.

### Glass Bottom Coral Reef & Turtles

This tour includes three different activities, making it comprehensive and entertaining. Step aboard a harbor cruise that highlights the colorful waterfront homes and harbor islands, and the history of the oldest English town in the New World. The second phase of this tour takes you directly to Bermuda's easternmost barrier reef to see firsthand the corals and fish which flourish on the world's most northern coral reef. You view all this without getting wet as the glass-bottom boat skims over the top of the colorful life below. The Coral Sea is a comfortable and elegant glass-bottom boat. On the way back to the harbor (weather permitting), visit the natural sea turtle habitat at St. Catherine's Bay where the hawk's bill and green turtles swim and live on the inner reef. Your captain and crew are well versed in Bermuda's ecological, natural and historical treasures and will provide an in-depth and entertaining commentary.

### Horse and Carriage Tour

Hibiscus, oleander, bermudiana (the National Flower) and bougainvillea are just some of the varieties found. Next, enjoy a stop at Palm Grove Gardens—attractive private gardens that include a unique reflecting pool with a stone representation of the map of Bermuda. There are also cages of exotic parrots as well as numerous tropical plants and shrubs. Once your garden tour is complete, you'll drive

through the Tucker's Town neighborhood, where the most exclusive homes on the island are located. These impressive homes belong to the rich and famous. View pristine estates and rambling mansions with manicured lawns in this gated community that is home to Ross Perot and New York Mayor Michael Bloomberg.

### Scenic St. George's Tour

And right next door is the Bermuda Perfumery, a 17th-century Heritage Trust home, with beautiful and fascinating open wooden beam ceilings and old-world architecture. On adjacent St. David's Island, you'll discover the charm of this unique and enchanting community as you absorb the imposing views of the Atlantic Ocean from St. David's Lighthouse. There will be several photo stops so bring your camera.

### St. George Olde Towne Railway Trolley Tour

Hop aboard a trolley on wheels to visit many points of St. George—once the terminus of the Bermuda Railway. St. George is, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and this excursion is an opportunity to appreciate the

You will view the renowned historic sites of the town, including King's Square, and explore the back streets and neighborhoods for an extraordinary look at nearly 400 years of history and culture. Begin with a look at Bermuda's unique architecture—many of these amazing buildings have strong American connections. The route will take you past streets with names such as Duke of York, Kent and Clarence that are a reminder of the town's British heritage. Keep an eye out for St. Peter's Church (the oldest Anglican Church in the Western Hemisphere), the Unfinished Church and Somers Gardens. During the coastal segment of your tour you will view beaches and pass by many important historical sites such as Fort St. Catherine and other forts that protected Bermuda for more than 300 years.

### St. George's Segway Experience

And, this high-tech gadget is easy to operate, environmentally friendly and self-balancing. The adventure begins with your safety in mind, and includes an in-depth training session. Before you know it, you will be gliding effortlessly along. Set out through the cobblestone streets of St. George, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. You

will use a wireless headset, which enables you to clearly hear your guide relay interesting historical facts about Bermuda and the town of St. George as you zip through narrow alleyways and enjoy scenic vistas. Along the way, explore the historical sites of the Unfinished Church, Fort St. Catherine and Tobacco Bay, and learn fascinating facts about the East End of the Island. This tour allows you ample opportunity for photos and memories you will cherish for a lifetime—a unique way to see and experience Bermuda.

The Coral Sea is a comfortable, elegant vessel and the knowledgeable crew explains the many differences between the diurnal and nocturnal reef dwellers as you enjoy the soft light of this romantic, early-evening interlude. Don't miss the St. George Heritage Night Street Festival either before or after your cruise. This tour leaves direct from the tender pier.

# Hamilton, Bermuda - Wednesday, May 11, 2011: North of the wide Sargasso Sea, Bermuda straddles the unlikely fence between all things British and Caribbean. Discover pink-sand beaches, colorful cottages and British colonial charm.

## Bermuda Colonial & Cultural Experience



Departs: 9:45 AM

This intimate tour includes a walk through the historic Verdmont House and a visit to the Masterworks Gallery at the Botanic Gardens. Your first stop is at Verdmont—a Georgian-style house built around 1710. Electricity and other modern amenities have never been installed here, so its charm is completely authentic and its preservation renders it a genuine architectural archive. As you wander at your leisure through the house, you will encounter a treasure trove of antique cedar and mahogany furniture, a fine collection of English and Chinese porcelain, portraits of former residents and a children's playroom complete with original furniture and toys. The house is set in pleasant gardens, which offer a lovely view of the ocean.

Flowers and shrubs found here are typical of those grown in 18th-century Bermuda. Next, you'll be whisked to the Masterworks Gallery located in the Botanic Gardens. This beautiful purpose-built structure boasts artwork painted by such luminaries as Georgia O'Keeffe, Winslow Homer and other household names. Time permitting, you can also stroll around the surrounding gardens which feature a September 11 Memorial and very special Sensory Garden for the Blind. Your last glimpse into the past will be at Fort Hamilton—a strategic fortification built above the capital city in the 1870s. It was intended to repel any attack to the area, but

no shot has ever been fired from here in anger. The fort is a labyrinth of winding subterranean stairways and is surrounded by a lovely moat garden. The upper ramparts of boast lush grassy areas and a panoramic view of the city, the harbor, Great Sound and even the south shore.

Please note: Minimum age is 10 years. Shade is limited at the fort; please dress accordingly. Bring a hat and wear sunscreen. Interior photography restrictions may be imposed at Verdmont and the gallery due to age or artifacts and artistic property rights. Verdmont House includes approximately 30 steps. On-site docents answer questions and provide background information.
