➤ frequently asked questions



what should i wear?

Comfortable walking shoes are recommended for all shore excursions. When you visit places of worship, we recommend dressing conservatively (no shorts or sleeveless tops), but casual clothing is perfectly acceptable. Dress in layers and have a jacket along. Bring an umbrella or raincoat, a hat and sunscreen.

what about meals?

Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. In-room dining is available on board.

how will i know what time each tour departs?

The on-board Shore Excursions Order Form in your stateroom will show departure times. This information will also be printed on your shore excursion tickets, which you will receive on board. Approximate tour departure times are posted on our website at www.hollandamerica.com.

i have a disability. how do i know which tours will best suit me? will i have a problem (dis)embarking the ship?

Guests with disabilities should inquire in advance whether a shore excursion will be able to accommodate their needs. We have graded the Shore Excursions according to the relative level of activity they entail. The walking icons that appear at the beginning of each tour description provide a general idea of the level of activity to expect. Please refer to the "How to Choose Your Tours" section in this brochure for specific information on the walking icons. It is important to keep in mind that shore excursion operators are subject to the laws of their own country including with respect to accommodating the needs of guests with disabilities. In most foreign countries, the laws are not as stringent as those in the United States. Please speak with the Shore Excursions Office as to whether you can expect to encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship in a particular port of call. In this regard, the decision whether or not to carry or provide other mobility assistance to a guest and their mobility assistance device (wheelchair, walker, etc.) up or down a ship's gangway, or on or off a tender boat, is at the sole discretion of the Captain,

made based on his evaluation of guest and crew safety.

We encourage you to bring a collapsible wheelchair as space limitations may restrict the ability of some tour operators to accommodate motorized mobility aid devices.

i am traveling with friends and we would like to be on the same motor coach

The departure location for each shore excursion is printed on your shore excursion tickets. If you wish to travel with friends, please arrive at the designated meeting place together. This will enable the staff to allocate space for you on the same vehicle.

tour durations

The individual tour descriptions include approximate durations. To allow our Shore Excursions Managers flexibility to coordinate your time in port with meals and activities on the ship, exact departure times are published in the Shore Excursions Order Form on board. Book online now, up until three days before sailing. Make your payment online via our secure website, and receive confirmation as well as your approximate tour departure times. You can also download the shore excursions, view tour prices, find answers to frequently asked questions and read general information.

Remember, online shore excursion reservations are processed prior to any requests made on board the ship and receive priority handling.

general information for booking online

At the time of making your reservations online, we will advise you whether or not your reservations are confirmed or whether you have been waitlisted. Your credit card will be charged immediately for all confirmed reservations. Should space become available for a waitlisted shore excursion request, we will e-mail or otherwise contact you at that time and either immediately charge your credit card if you have already given us your credit card information or ask you to provide us with that information for immediate charge processing. Shore excursion reservations are subject to cancellation by us at any time prior to the credit card charge being accepted by your bank. If you or Holland America cancel a tour more than 3 days prior to cruise departure, we will issue a credit on the credit card that you used to pay for the reservation. For any cancellation within 3 days of departure, a credit will not be given on your credit card. Instead, we will apply an ONBOARD CREDIT ONLY policy under which the refund (less any cancellation fee) will show up as a credit to the shipboard account of the person who was to take the shore excursion. If the credit is not fully utilized during the cruise, the balance will be paid to that guest by the ship's Purser.

➤ how to choose your tours



Choose your shore excursions by using these icons as a general guide to the level of activity involved, and select the shore excursions best suited to your physical capabilities.



easy activity: Very light activity including short distances to walk; may include some steps.



moderate activity: Requires intermittent effort throughout, including walking medium distances over uneven surfaces and/or steps.



strenuous activity: Requires active participation, walking long distances over uneven and steep terrain or on steps. In certain instances, paddling or other non-walking activity is required and guests must be able to participate without discomfort or difficulty breathing.



panoramic: Specially designed for guests who enjoy a slower pace, these excursions offer sightseeing mainly from the transportation vehicle, with few or no stops, and no mandatory disembarkation during the tour. As vehicles outside the USA are rarely lift-equipped and ramps are seldom available, a very small amount of walking will be necessary. The pace will be gentle and taking your time is encouraged.



limited capacity: The number of people able to participate in this tour is strictly limited. Reasons for limiting capacity may include the number of transportation seats available, or to maintain a safe ratio of guides for hikes, fishing and water activities. Tours require a minimum number of participants to operate.




meal: This tour includes a meal—lunch on daytime tours, or dinner on evening tours.

A Day in Punta del Este

Take a guided motor coach drive through downtown Montevideo, past the Old City and Independence Square, Parque Batlle with its ox-cart monument, obelisk and Estadio Centenario, en route to Punta del Este. Your visit to Punta del Este takes you to the most important and famous seaside resort of South America, located 85 miles east of Montevideo. Punta del Este resembles a hand reaching into the ocean and is famous for its natural resources and high-profile visitors. Many international contests take place in Punta, including car races, rugby, tennis and golf tournaments. Get acquainted with this fabulous place while viewing several up-scale residential and natural areas, such as Pinares, Playa Mansa, Playa Brava, Portezuelo, Beverly Hills, Punta Ballena and San Rafael Casino Hotel—a Tudor-style seat of international meetings.

A Taste of Montevideo & The Wine Trail

Rich with European heritage, Montevideo reflects in its architecture and attitude the varied culture of its early settlers, who came from Spain, Portugal and Italy. A relaxing drive will show you the highlights of the city, including some of its historical landmarks—the Plaza Independencia and the Palacio Legislativo. The latter boasts of being among the three most beautiful Parliament buildings in the world. Keep an eye out for the Battle y Ordenez Park, Prado Park and the Carrasco residential area. Continue your journey into the countryside, where your destination is a traditional winery. Bouza Winery Boutique, located at the source of the Melilla Stream, is surrounded by native woods. The Bouza family has always believed that working on a small scale produces better wines, and they take great care in applying this concept to every stage of the winemaking process. Learn about the techniques of winemaking, about the differences in vintages and varieties, and how the vineyards are cared for. An extensive visit to the cellar is included, as well as a quick look inside the impressive museum of classic cars and motorbikes. Before lunch a wine tasting will take place including four different types of wine—Chardonnay-Albarino (white wine), Bouza Merlot Tannat, Bouza Tannat and the premium, top blend called Monte Vide Eu.

After the wine tasting enjoy the best Uruguayan meats for lunch. As you dine, watch a demonstration of the typical Uruguayan tango. Afterwards, you will have time to relax and enjoy the surroundings of this impressive winery.

Please note: The panoramic city tour will take about one hour. Your stay at Bouza Winery is approximately five hours.

Colonia del Sacramento

Visit the picturesque streets of Colonia Del Sacramento, the oldest city in Uruguay. Recently declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO, Colonia was founded by the Portuguese in 1680. Today, the old city has a lot to say about its colonial past. The streets of Santa Rita, San Gabriel, Matriz Church, San Pedro Road, Bastion del Carmen and the famous Street of Sighs are often used as a backdrop for historical films. These landmarks lie among the city's cobblestone streets. Colonia's pure, natural setting on the Uruguay River complements its archaeological value.

Please note: The drive from Montevideo is two hours each way. No inside visits are included.

Highlights of Montevideo by Steam Train & Bus

Board a fully-refurbished steam train for a 45 -minute ride through the industrial section of Montevideo. The refurbishment project was a direct response to movement to recover Uruguay's cultural heritage. Recreating the nation's legendary railway tradition was a project completed with both private money and public donations. You will ride in the comfort of the air-conditioned rail cars. Next, board a motor coach and continue through Montevideo. You will see the Legislative Palace—a beautiful, ornate structure in marble. Continue on, stopping at Prado Park, noted for its historical monuments and attractive gardens featuring a stunning display of roses. The tour passes along the city's many beautiful beaches and the Rambla, which is the beachfront. You'll see the well-preserved Town Hall, Montevideo Cathedral and Independence Plaza, surrounded by such landmarks as Government House and the historic Solis Theater.

Montevideo Architecture & Old Town

Montevideo is an eclectic mix of architectural influences, with amazing buildings dating back to very prosperous times. The city is really an open-air exhibition of monuments, sculptures and museums, displaying the wonderful work of Uruguayan artists and architects. Travel by motor coach to the heart of the Old Town at Independencia Square. From there, you will walk to see the Palacio Salvo and to enter the magnificent Teatro Solis. Continue to Torres Garcia Museum, housing the works of one the best-known Uruguayan artists. At Matriz Square you will find the cathedral, the banking quarter and the Gurvich Museum. Passing by the 1908 Casa Rivera Museum, once a private residence but now a National Historic Monument, continue to the Palacio Taranco for an inside visit. And finally, at Plaza Zabala, re-board the bus for the drive back to the ship.

structure. Continue on, stopping at Prado Park, noted for its historical monuments, attractive gardens and stunning display of roses. A Taste of the Falklands: Long Island Farm Experience



Departs: 9:30 AM

The hour-long journey to Long Island Farm takes in the fantastic scenery of East Falklands. Long Island is situated approximately 20 miles from Stanley and is a 22,000-acre sheep farm completely run in traditional Falkland style. The Watson family use skilled sheep dogs and island-bred horses, milk their own cows, make their own bread, butter and cream, and use the traditional peat fuel. Watch the skilled sheep dogs at work and enjoy a sheep-shearing demonstration, with an opportunity to buy some genuine Falkland wool. Tea, coffee and home-baked cookies are served in the farmhouse kitchen. There's time to stroll the white sand beach directly in front of the house and anywhere you like on the farm.

Please note: Wear comfortable walking shoes. Dress in layers with a warm, waterproof jacket or sweater and a warm hat. You will receive a copy of the Falkland Islands standard visitor guide, a Long Island brochure and a stamped postcard depicting scenes of Stanley.

Bluff Cove Penguin Rookery

Don't miss this exciting tour—the 2009 winner of Seatrade's coveted "Innovative Shorex of the Year" award. Set off over paved roads for about 20 minutes before you switch to four-wheel-drive off-roading for another 30 minutes. You'll cross private farmland en route to a penguin colony where approximately 1,000 pairs of Gentoo penguins nest beside a beautiful sandy beach. There is also a small breeding colony of king penguins here. Magellan or jackass penguins nest seasonally in burrows nearby. Skuas, gulls and snowy sheathbills prey on eggs or chicks, while upland geese, ruddy-headed geese, Magellanic oystercatchers, Falklands flightless steamer ducks and other birds make their homes close by. Diddle-dee (a local plant) grows in abundance—its red berries are edible and are made into jam for the "cream teas" served at the beachside Sea Cabbage Café. This new Bluff Cove Museum depicts life in the Falklands and tells the story of the local area. Find out about the farm, the Sugar Wreck, the 1982 war between Britain and Argentina, and the fabulous lagoon wildlife. Watch live demonstrations of spinning and felting with local wool. Also in the Museum is a small gift shop selling unique Bluff Cove souvenirs. You will have one hour to take photographs, stroll along the beach, look around the museum and



purchase treats in the cafe.

This tour will travel by minibus and take in the main sights of Stanley, then change to 4x4 transportation at Murrell Farm. From here, an experienced overland driver/guide will navigate the terrain to the rockhopper penguin colony where wardens will be on hand to offer information and assistance. This tour takes in Fitzroy and three Battle Memorials depicting the fierce hand to hand battles between Argentina and Britain in 1982. In conditions reminiscent of World War I, British soldiers fought to end the forced Argentine occupation of the islands. Sapper Hill, Mt. William, Mt. Tumbledown, Mt. Harriet and the Two Sisters battlefields will be viewed and discussed. Mt. Longdon and Wireless Ridge will also be seen. Your main destination is Fitzroy and Port Pleasant (one hour from Stanley), where the British Logistic landing ships Sir Galahad and Sir

Tristram were bombed by Argentine Skyhawk aircraft while transferring troops, ammunition and equipment. See memorials for the Welsh Guards and Royal Fleet Auxiliary. The settlement of Fitzroy is primarily a sheep farm but is diversifying, and you will make a short stop here to see the progress. If time allows you will also view where the Royal Marine barracks were located.

Please note: Binoculars are recommended. Wear comfortable walking shoes. Cool temperatures will likely prevail. Bring a warm, waterproof jacket or sweater, a warm hat and binoculars. You will receive a large fold-out glossy map depicting the land campaign, a copy of the Falkland Islands standard visitor guide and a stamped postcard depicting various war memorials.

For the wildlife enthusiast, this is an exclusive opportunity to view the impressive birdlife of the Falkland Islands. Transfer by minibus to nearby Hadassa Bay, where your walk will begin. Your expert, local guide will distribute a tour-specific illustrated checklist and give a general background to Falkland birds and what you might expect to see on this tour: dark-faced ground tyrants, Falkland thrush, upland geese, long-tailed meadowlark, Falkland flightless steamer duck, rock cormorants, southern giant petrels, sooty shearwaters, Magellan penguins, black-throated finch and up to as many as 30 other species. There are also spectacular views of

Stanley from this picturesque bay.

Please note: Bring binoculars, camera, pen and pencil. Any guest having to use any form of walking aid will not be allowed to begin this tour. Tour entails 3½ miles of brisk walking over uneven terrain, so guests must be extremely physically able. This walk is classed as strenuous due to the rough terrain. Water is included for each guest. Majestic Penguins Volunteer Point

Volunteer Point is home to 1,200 adult king penguins, plus several hundred chicks. It is the largest colony of king penguins in the world outside of South Georgia Island. Seeing king penguins at all, let alone up close, is an almost unheard-of event. It is an enormous privilege for even the most experienced and jaded traveler, and is not to be passed up. In addition to the king penguins, there are also approximately 1,000 Gentoo penguins and several thousand Magellan penguins at this location. Volunteer Point is approximately 50 miles from Stanley—it takes about 2½ hours of driving to reach it. Most of the route is on a newly-built gravel road, while the final quarter of the journey is an adventure in itself as it is over a grassy track in a 4x4 vehicle. The gravel road ends at the sheep farm of Johnson Harbour, where the real adventure begins. The route takes in a variety of challenges that fully test the skill of the off-road driver. Small streams, bridges, ditches

and peat bogs are encountered along the way. Don't be put off by the nature of the drive—the reward is that eventually you will arrive at the king penguin colony situated between a beautiful, long, white-sand beach and a saltwater lagoon. There are wonderful photographic opportunities as the outgoing and friendly king penguins elegantly pose, dressed to kill in their superb coloring of white, gold, yellow and black feathering. They are unafraid and are happy to go about their business as if you were not there. A spring or early summer visit to the location provides a chance to see the fluffy brown chicks that match their parents in size. Within a half-mile radius, the high-nesting Gentoo and burrowing Magellan penguins can be seen. A few minutes' walk to the sandy beach allows you to see all three species mixing and moving as they head out to sea in search of food or return to their colonies. Again, there are superb photo opportunities as the penguins dive and swim with amazing agility. A two-hour stay at the location provides time to see the penguins at play and enjoy a snack before setting off for the return journey to Stanley. It cannot be overstated that this is truly unusual opportunity to see all three species of penguin in such prolific numbers along with the stark and beautiful Falklands countryside, a typical small sheep farm, and the Battle Mountains of 1982.

Please note: A sack lunch will be provided. This tour is not suitable for guests with back, hip, and neck or mobility problems. Wear comfortable walking shoes. Photograph Government House, where building work began in 1845 but it was 1859 before the first Governor took up residence. Outside Stanley, enjoy a drive by the local airport and Surf Bay to see the beach and minefields from 1982. At Whalebone Cove, see the hull of the Lady Elizabeth—a three-masted iron barque from the turn of the 20th century.

Your guide will give a detailed explanation into the Falklands War. You will also take in the Lady Elizabeth shipwreck, the minefields at Surf Bay and the totem pole before heading towards Government House, the Battle Memorial and the Jhelum Shipwreck. Your tour includes a visit to the Falkland Islands Museum, Britannia House where you will browse among whaling paraphernalia and other items pertaining to Stanley industries past and present. You will then head back towards the town center passing the 1982 Liberation Memorial which was built as a tribute to the British Forces personnel and civilians who lost there lives during the 1982 Falklands Conflict. You will also see St. Mary's Catholic Church, Victory Green—commemorating the First World War—Christ Church Cathedral and the Jubilee Villas built in 1887 to commemorate Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee. Your guide will then escort you to the Sheep Shearing & Craft show where you will experience the atmosphere of an authentic sheep shearing shed with an overview of sheep farming in the Falkland Islands, from the distant past to the present day. You will marvel at the speed and skill with which sheep are shorn, and don't miss the opportunity to view traditional wool spinning and weaving by skilled local artists.

The trail leads straight into the Fuegian forest and you will learn about the native flora and fauna. Here, there is a 360-degree view of the various mountain chains--the Vinciguerra, the Sorondo hills and the Alvear chain. While your snack is being prepared, hike out to explore the forest. Upon your return, juicy steak is served with a spicy onion and red pepper sauce, salads, wine and soft drinks. Re-board the 4x4 for the return back to your ship.

Finally, you'll arrive at Lapataia Bay, the southernmost place that can be reached by road. This is where the famous Panamerican Highway ends.

National Park & Beagle Channel

Heading on towards Lapataia Bay, you will board a catamaran and take in Lapataia and Ensenada Bays. Navigate the Beagle Channel all the way to the Bridges Islands and Les Eclaireurs lighthouse.

The Train to the End of the World



A motor coach awaits for the return scenic journey to Ushuaia with beautiful views of the Beagle Channel and beyond.

It is essential that you wear warm, layered clothing and comfortable shoes in order to fully enjoy and participate in this excursion. Punta Arenas, Chile - Friday, February 11, 2011: This remote town, pioneered by Yugoslav settlers and sheep ranchers, sits on rolling hills overlooking the Strait of Magellan.

Antarctica Landing

Antarctica covers an area of over five million square miles and is the windiest, coldest and least populated of Planet Earth's seven continents. It differs from the Arctic in that there are no terrestrial animals in Antarctica, but there is terra firma under much of the snow and ice. All the wildlife consists of seasonal visitors that come ashore in the spring and summer. The massive ice sheet covering almost the entire continent represents the largest freshwater reserve in the world, containing approximately 90% of the world's ice and 68% of its water. Surprisingly, however, Antarctica is also the driest continent in the world--drier than the Sahara Desert. This fantastic excursion to the far reaches of the world is designed for our more adventurous and hardy guests--those who wish to follow in the footsteps of the great explorers and adventurers of yesteryear: Ernest Shackleton, Douglas Mawson, Roald Amundsen and Robert Scott. Your expedition begins with a motor coach transfer to Carlos Ibañez del Campo Airport in Punta Arenas. If favorable weather conditions prevail, you will board a BAE-146 (or similar) aircraft and take to the skies, setting course southward over the Strait of Magellan, Tierra del Fuego Island, Beagle Channel and Cape Horn. You will cross the Antarctic Convergence, where the Southern Ocean collides with the circumpolar Antarctic current, the natural boundary of Antarctica and, at latitude 60

degrees south, the political boundary as you enter Antarctic airspace. During the 2- to 2½-hour flight, you will learn about the presence of human beings on the White Continent, as well as its history, geography, wildlife and politics. You will hear specifics about King George Island and all that you will see and do there. There will be special emphasis on minimizing your impact on the pristine and fragile ecosystem (IAATO Guidelines of Conduct for Antarctica Visitors). Your aircraft will land at Frei Base, managed by the Chilean Air Force. The base is one of the main meteorological and navigational stations in Antarctica (and is composed of approximately 21 main buildings shared by eight nations). Chile's station was built in 1969 and houses 150 people during the summer months. The base is situated on an ice-free area of the island as, logistically, less snow is better. As you disembark from your aircraft, brace for below-freezing temperatures and take a moment to acclimate yourself to your location. (Separating into smaller groups, you will begin an exploration of Antarctica, specifically focusing on the wildlife that migrates to this region). Your exploration begins and your first activity will be a one-mile walk on a dirt road to Villa Las Estrellas. The "Village of the Stars" consists of permanent housing and scientific facilities for researchers and Air Force personnel. You will find that the buildings are neither luxurious nor charming--but they are quintessentially Antarctic. Weather permitting you will board a zodiac to cross over to Ardley Island, ASPA # 150 (Antarctic Specially Protected Area). Ardley is one of the Antarctic's most protected areas where chinstrap, Gentoo and

Adélie penguins breed. Because of its status, only 20 persons are allowed on the island at one time, therefore you will separate into smaller groups. Relays are mandatory and you will be accompanied by a certified Antarctic guide. You will spend approximately 4½ hours on land before re-joining your aircraft for the return flight to Punta Arenas. Enjoy a late lunch on board before arriving in Punta Arenas, where you will rejoin your ship.

Warm winter clothing is acceptable--similar to what you would wear if you were going skiing in a cold climate area. Waterproof boot covers will be provided so sturdy hiking shoes are adequate. Other items listed below are suggestions that may make your experience more comfortable:

- Waterproof trekking boots suitable for snow/mud
- 2 pairs of thin wool socks and 2 pairs of thick wool socks
- 2 pairs of polar fleece or thick waterproof pants
- Windproof Gore Tex pants or ski pants
- 2 long-sleeved woolen t-shirts and 2 polar fleece sweatshirts
- Thin wool or polar fleece gloves and a pair of thick ski-type gloves or mittens
- Long winter parka made of Gore Tex
- Ski headband or earmuffs and woolen hat
- Scarf or neckwarmer
- Sunglasses
- Ski goggles
- Thermal/woolen long underwear

Accessories:

- First aid kit including prescribed medications
- High SPF sunblock/sunscreen, lip balm, toiletries
- Camera, batteries and film
- Backpack and/or fanny pack
- Binoculars

Please note: Items listed cannot be rented in Punta Arenas. Should the Antarctica Landing not be possible due to inclement weather, an alternative route will be taken to Torres del Paine. Grand Patagonia Overland Adventure (Double)

Day 1 (L, D)

The journey to Puerto Natales begins by traveling 40 miles northwest into the Patagonia countryside and Otway Sound. The undulating terrain features just enough low vegetation to conceal guanacos and rheas (South American ostrich). The last stretch to the Sound is on a gravel road. At Otway Sound, leave your coach and hike for about two miles across grassland interspersed with sandy areas to a penguin rookery by the seashore. A large colony of Magellan

penguins nests and breeds here between October and March. They are naturally curious but if approached too quickly they will scamper into their burrows or try to reach the water. Do not attempt to touch them as their beaks can inflict serious wounds. After ample time to observe the birds walk back to the coach and continue the drive towards Estancia Olga Teresa. Olga Teresa Farm is situated on the slopes of Palomares Mountain. A colony of condors nests on the upper part of the mountain. Enjoy a barbecue of tasty Patagonian lamb, grilled slowly for hours over the fire. Try baked empanadas, and wine or soft drinks. The lunch takes place in a semi-covered area outside. Wear warm clothes as it can be chilly. After lunch, watch *huasos* (Chilean cowboys) rounding up a flock of sheep with their well-trained horses and dogs, a demonstration of sheep shearing and the *huasos*' considerable skills with cattle. Later in the afternoon drive to Puerto Natales and check in at the hotel.

Day 2 (B, L, D)

After ample time to observe the birds walk back to the coach and continue the drive towards Estancia Olga Teresa. Olga Teresa Farm is situated on the slopes of Palomares Mountain. A colony of condors nests on the upper part of the mountain. Enjoy a barbecue of tasty Patagonian lamb, grilled slowly for hours over the fire. Try baked empanadas, and wine or soft drinks. The lunch takes place in a semi-covered area outside. Wear warm clothes as it can be chilly. After lunch, watch *huasos* (Chilean cowboys) rounding up a flock of sheep with their well-trained horses and dogs, a demonstration of sheep shearing and the

huasos' considerable skills with cattle. Later in the afternoon drive to Puerto Natales and check in at the hotel.

Off the Beaten Track: Magdalena Penguin Reserve

Begin with an approximately 1½-hour ferry ride across the famous Strait of Magellan sailing the same waters as Sir Francis Drake and Charles Darwin. On arrival at Magdalena Island, declared a natural monument in 1982, you will see one of the largest penguin colonies in southern Chile, and get acquainted with an unspoiled habitat with penguins, cormorants and many other birds.

A substantial colony of Magellan penguins are nesting and breeding here. Since this is a wildlife reserve, no tourist facilities are available. Walking is on mostly flat, marked pathways. These penguins return every year to this spot between October and March to lay eggs and raise their young. They bury their eggs in the sandy burrows and under shrubs; at this time of year most of the chicks will have hatched. The animals are naturally curious and untamed; if approached too quickly they will scamper into their burrows or try to reach the water. Do not attempt to touch them as their bites can inflict serious wounds. Following ample time to observe the birds it is time for the invigorating walk back to the ferry and the navigation back to Punta Arenas, where your bus will be waiting to take you back to the pier. You will have about one hour on the island to observe the curious and entertaining penguins before returning to Punta Arenas.

Please note: There is approximately 30 minutes of walking over uneven terrain. A snack pack will be provided. We recommend bringing a windbreaker and scarf, and wearing sturdy walking shoes. Don't forget to bring your camera. The motor coach will drive to the ferry where guests will be boarding the for a ride across the Strait of Magellan to Magdalena Island. The Patagonian Institute, which exhibits a collection of old local cars and machinery, welcomes you at your first stop on this tour. The Institute also displays a small botanical garden and exhibits pictures of Punta Arenas dating back to 1905. At the Naval & Maritime Museum, you will find photos depicting various ships and the port activity over the past century, as well as small ship replicas and other artifacts. Located just three miles from Punta Arenas is a typical farm that belongs to a family of pioneers, close to the urban environment, but a million miles away. You will visit the main farmhouse and the farm's facilities, and enjoy a lamb barbecue at the farm's restaurant. After lunch, head south along the Strait of Magellan, past Leñadura, Punta Santa Maria, Guairabo, Agua Fresca and Rinconada Bulnes, en route to Fort Bulnes. Chile took possession of the Strait and Patagonia in 1843 by establishing its first

settlement and fort at this site. Set strategically on a rocky bluff overlooking the Strait, the fort was soon abandoned in favor of Punta Arenas, where the climate was far more benign. The present fort is a re-creation of the original, with reconstructed buildings including a church, jail, post office and stables. A short distance away is Puerto Hambre (Port Famine), the site of Pedro Sarmiento de Gamboa's ill-fated 1584 settlement under the orders of King Felipe of Spain. Little remains of the ruins except a memorial plaque. Thomas Cavendish landed at this site and found only the remains of the city. He renamed it Port Famine. The drive back to Punta Arenas is along the coastal road with a stop at the observation point at La Cruz Hill for a view of the city and the Strait of Magellan.

Gear supplied is the highest-quality harness equipment—the same as is used for professional climbing. 

boat across to Chidhuapi Island, where you will meet Juanita and Ricardo and their family, who live in a modest house. They will share with you, in an ambience characterized by a complete lack of luxury, their interesting life and will show you how their happiness stems from the simple things in life—family and a sense of belonging to an extraordinary, ancient culture. Juanita prepares the bread, while Ricardo brings the shellfish and lights the fire. You are most welcome, should you choose, to participate in the preparation and uncovering of the curanto. After your traditional, hearty and truly delicious lunch, take a stroll to the nearby cemetery, and a walk along the coast far from the bustle of city life.
