

what should i wear?

Comfortable walking shoes are recommended for all shore excursions. When you visit places of worship, we recommend dressing conservatively (no shorts or sleeveless tops), but casual clothing is perfectly acceptable. Dress in layers and have a jacket along. Bring an umbrella or raincoat, a hat and sunscreen.

what about meals?

Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. In-room dining is available on board.

how will i know what time each tour departs?

The on-board Shore Excursions Order Form in your stateroom will show departure times. This information will also be printed on your shore excursion tickets, which you will receive on board. Approximate tour departure times are posted on our website at www.hollandamerica.com.

i have a disability. how do i know which tours will best suit me? will i have a problem (dis)embarking the ship?

Guests with disabilities should inquire in advance whether a shore excursion will be able to accommodate their needs. We have graded the Shore Excursions according to the relative level of activity they entail. The walking icons that appear at the beginning of each tour description provide a general idea of the level of activity to expect. Please refer to the "How to Choose Your Tours" section in this brochure for specific information on the walking icons. It is important to keep in mind that shore excursion operators are subject to the laws of their own country including with respect to accommodating the needs of guests with disabilities. In most foreign countries, the laws are not as stringent as those in the United States. Please speak with the Shore Excursions Office as to whether you can expect to encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship in a particular port of call. In this regard, the decision whether or not to carry or provide other mobility assistance to a guest and their mobility assistance device (wheelchair, walker, etc.) up or down a ship's gangway, or on or off a tender boat, is at the sole discretion of the Captain, made based on his evaluation of guest and crew safety. We encourage you to bring a collapsible wheelchair as space limitations may restrict the ability of some tour operators to accommodate motorized mobility aid devices.

i am traveling with friends and we would like to be on the same motor coach

The departure location for each shore excursion is printed on your shore excursion tickets. If you wish to travel with friends, please arrive at the designated meeting place together. This will enable the staff to allocate space for you on the same vehicle.

tour durations

The individual tour descriptions include approximate durations. To allow our Shore Excursions Managers flexibility to coordinate your time in port with meals and activities on the ship, exact departure times are published in the Shore Excursions Order Form on board. For more information, please attend the Shore Excursions Presentation or visit the Shore Excursions Office.

Remember, online shore excursion reservations are processed prior to any requests made on board the ship and receive priority handling.


general information for booking online

At the time of making your reservations online, we will advise you whether or not your reservations are confirmed or whether you have been waitlisted. Your credit card will be charged immediately for all confirmed reservations. Should space become available for a waitlisted shore excursion request, we will e-mail or otherwise contact you at that time and either immediately charge your credit card if you have already given us your credit card information or ask you to provide us with that information for immediate charge processing. Shore excursion reservations are subject to cancellation by us at any time prior to the credit card charge being accepted by your bank. If you or Holland America cancel a tour more than 3 days prior to cruise departure, we will issue a credit on the credit card that you used to pay for the reservation. For any cancellation within 3 days of departure, a credit will not be given on your credit card. Instead, we will apply an ONBOARD CREDIT ONLY policy under which the refund (less any cancellation fee) will show up as a credit to the shipboard account of the person who was to take the shore excursion. If the credit is not fully utilized during the cruise, the balance will be paid to that guest by the ship's Purser.

 expand the experience: take more than one tour in each port



Make the most of your time in each port by combining different half-day tours to complete a full day of sightseeing. how to choose your tours



Choose your shore excursions by using these icons as a general guide to the level of activity involved, and select the shore excursions best suited to your physical capabilities.



easy activity: Very light activity including short distances to walk; may include some steps.



moderate activity: Requires intermittent effort throughout, including walking medium distances over uneven surfaces and/or steps.



strenuous activity: Requires active participation, walking long distances over uneven and steep terrain or on steps. In certain instances, paddling or other non-walking activity is required and guests must be able to participate without discomfort or difficulty breathing.



panoramic: Specially designed for guests who enjoy a slower pace, these excursions offer sightseeing mainly from the transportation vehicle, with few or no stops, and no mandatory disembarkation during the tour. As vehicles outside the USA are rarely lift-equipped and ramps are seldom available, a very small amount of walking will be necessary. The pace will be gentle and taking your time is encouraged.



limited capacity: The number of people able to participate in this tour is strictly limited. Reasons for limiting capacity may include the number of transportation seats available, or to maintain a safe ratio of guides for hikes, fishing and water activities. Tours require a minimum number of participants to operate.



meal: This tour includes a meal—lunch on daytime tours, or dinner on evening tours.



snack: This tour includes a small snack or tasting of local specialties. The snack is not a meal.

Privacy, comfort, safety, and personalized guide service are also yours to enjoy.

about the transportation: Each type of transportation will be of the highest grade available in that port. Not all modes of transportation are available in all locations. For information about the transportation sizes and availability, please see our website at www.hollandamerica.com.

pricing: The cost of each type of transportation will be published online at www.hollandamerica.com.

also included: The cost includes the service of a driver and English-speaking guide, unlimited mileage, road tolls, parking fees and bottled water.

not included (unless otherwise noted): Guests' entrance fees for attractions are not included in the price due to the wide range of attraction possibilities, uncertain number of attractions to be visited, and varying number of guests participating. We strongly recommend that you bring some local currency to cover such costs as credit cards are not readily accepted in some ports. Lunch will not be included on any tour as many guests prefer to select their own dining venue.

itinerary planning: If you need help planning your personal itinerary, the Port Lecturer and/or Shore Excursions Manager can assist you and will gladly answer your questions. This can be very helpful in many destinations where travel time, location, holidays, and opening hours of attractions need to be taken into consideration in order to maximize the efficiency of your time ashore.

online reservations: The fastest and easiest way for you to reserve and pay for your Signature Collection experience is on the Holland America Line website. Visit us online at www. hollandamerica.com. Please note the cost will be per mode of transportation (not per person), so only one person in the party needs to make the reservation. The price shown on the website is the total cost for the transportation, driver and guide (not a per-person price). In many ports, availability is extremely limited. Please reserve as early as possible.

payment & tour vouchers: Your credit card will be charged after your reservation is confirmed. Next, start planning what you'll do with your Signature Collection experience in each port. On board the ship, you will be given a form to advise the Shore Excursions Office of the itinerary you have chosen.

booking on board: The Signature Collection may be available for booking once you are on the ship, but this cannot be guaranteed. Please check with the Shore Excursions Office on board.

disembarking the ship: In some disembarkation ports, a private vehicle and guide can be used for sightseeing en route to the airport. When booking, please advise the total amount of luggage for your party. Size of vehicle and luggage space may limit the number of guests in the vehicle.

Experience Half Moon Cay from the natural inner saltwater lagoon on a guided personal watercraft adventure. After a short tram ride, you'll arrive at the safety briefing area and have time to get used to your personal sit-on watercraft. Depart single file with a lead guide and another guide bringing up the rear. Traveling along the picturesque shoreline of the island you'll navigate around the natural reef formations, inlets, islands and sand spits before stopping for an ice-cold bottle of water. Buoyed courses will allow you to test your watercraft skills. With your guide, you'll briefly stop at the tidal outlet, the Indian village and Stingray Cove.

Please note: Wear your swimsuit; bring a towel, sunscreen and a hat. Minimum age is 16 years. A valid driver's license is required and must be shown to tour operator prior to being allowed to participate in excursion.

All aboard for a behind-the-scenes peek at the highlights of Half Moon Cay from the comfort of a shaded, **open-air tram**, accompanied by a professional guide. This excursion is designed to acquaint you with

the many and varied visitor areas, activities,

and amenities the island offers. First, head out along the coastline from the marina to Cannon Point for an overview of the beach activities and beautiful views of the bay and your ship. See the island's interdenominational chapel and do a circuit of the Dining Pavilion roundabout. Next, check out Pegasus Ranch and the Island 'airport' where seaplanes take off and land. The same 700acre lagoon is also used for jet-skiing, glassbottom boating and kayaking. A brief stop at the stingray center provides a different perspective of the lagoon and the chance to see stingrays in their natural habitat. Back on the tram, you'll drive past farms that showcase local crops grown for sustainability and beautification of the island. The industrial area, including the recycling and power plants, serves many very important purposes. Conclude your tour at Lustre, the pearl kiosk, where you may wish to browse for a memento of your visit.

Notes:

Minimum age is 3 years. Wear sunglasses and sunscreen; bring a hat.

Clamshell Sunshade Rental (Includes 2 Chairs)

Relax under your very own **clamshell** on the beautiful and aptly named beach at Half Moon Cay—a crescent-shaped stretch of powdery white sand and inviting turquoise water.

Eco Lagoon Cruise





Departs: 9:00 AM, 9:45 AM, 10:15 AM, 11:00 AM, 11:30 AM, 12:35 PM Approximately 1¼ Hours Adult \$34.95; Child \$24.95

Board a **boat** with **glass-bottom viewers** and cross the lagoon, as you learn about Half Moon Cay and Bahamian history, culture, flora and fauna. Stingrays, nurse sharks, lemon sharks, bonefish, conch, sea urchins and assorted marine life are raised here. Half Moon Cay is also an official sanctuary for bird watching. Through the boat's glass floor, discover a series of living reefs, where fish, coral and anemones are plentiful.

Please note: Not suitable for guests who suffer from motion sickness.

Eco Lagoon Kayak Adventure





Departs: 10:00 AM, Noon Approximately 1¼ Hours Price \$39.95

Join an island guide on a **kayak** adventure on **Bone Fish Lagoon**. The lagoon comprises more than 1,400 acres of protected habitat and is home to numerous species of flora ranging from red mangroves to the ornamental silver buttonwood tree.

Please note: Wear your swimsuit; bring a towel, sunscreen and a hat. No restrooms available.

Eco-Bike & Hike





Departs: 10:15 AM, 11:45 AM Approximately 1½ Hours Price \$39.95

After a safety briefing, set out with your guide on a bike ride that shows you the "back of the house." This **behind-the-scenes glimpse** of Half Moon Cay takes you past the staff housing units, offices, reverse-osmosis water plant, electrical generator, incinerator, bilge water processing plant, recycling center, maintenance and fabrication shop. Next, you will pass Half Moon Cay Marina and the dining pavilion on the way to Pegasus Ranch, where you will take a brief rest. Remount your bike for a short ride to the seaplane landing area for **refreshments**. You'll leave your bike behind as your hike begins here. Keep an eye out for birds that are occasionally seen here, such as the Bahamas mocking bird, wood dove, white crown pigeon, tobacco dove, Cuban finch, banana bird, poor Joe and burrowing owl. Climb the ridge, which boasts a first-stage lookout with an awesome view of Bone Fish Lagoon, Stingray Park and the Water Sports Rental Center. You'll find yourself standing on the foundation ruins of a limestone dwelling from the 1700s. The vegetation in this area are trees of Madeira bark, pigeon plum, wild tamarind, Bahamian hardwoods, sapodilla, camalamy bark, seven-year apple, silver buttonwood, love vine and sisal cactus. The latter is used for rope making. Cross over a dividing wall that is hundreds of years old. On the other side you will pass additional ruins en route to the eastern lookout. Here you will see magnificent views of the eastern tip of Half Moon Cay, Goat Cay, Long Rocks and Cat Island, some 18 miles away. Wind

your way back westward on the north face of the ridge. There are two ponds here, one brackish and one saltwater. Early settlers worked the salt pond to harvest salt for trading. Follow the path down to a freshwater well used by pirates. You'll step through an amazing patch of lovely native orchids. Continue to the main area of ruins where remnants of many limestone structures lie. The western tip of the island can be seen from here. The view includes the island of Eleuthera and your cruise ship. You will continue through a cactus patch leading down a narrow footpath back to the lagoon.

Please note: Minimum weight is 80 lbs; maximum weight is 225 lbs. Minimum age is 10 years; maximum age is 80 years. Minimum height is 5 feet; maximum height is 7 feet. Wear shorts, a t-shirt and aqua shoes, sneakers or sandals.

Eco-Bike & Kayak Adventure





Departs: 10:00 AM, 11:30 AM Approximately 1½ Hours Price \$64.95

Begin this fascinating and insightful tour with a five-minute tram ride from the Welcome Center. You'll meet your guide at the point where bike equipment is distributed. After a safety briefing, set out with your guide on a bike ride, stopping first at Stingray Cove. Watch as trained divers interact with southern stingrays, feeding and petting them as you look on. Continue to the Half Moon Cay Island Nursery & Farm. This ecofriendly facility is fed by a natural spring and makes use of composted landscaping clippings, seaweed, mulch and, of course, manure from the horse stables. Among the

many species grown here are coconut and palms trees, raised for transplanting throughout the island, and indigenous flowering plants. The vegetable patch produces local vegetables and herbs used in the local cuisine. Citrus trees, such as key lime, bitter orange, and grapefruit, grow fruit for juice, marinades and dressings. The chicken coop provides free-range eggs that are harvested daily from chickens fed with corn raised on the island's farm. The on-site lime kiln provides the mineral that has been used in the construction of Bahamian homes since the early 1700s—it derives from reduced conch shells. The lime is used to sanitize the walls of rock abodes. Remnants of these dwelling can be viewed at the historical ruins along your route. Snap a few photos of the horses at Pegasus Ranch; then, head to Half Moon Cay's saltwater lagoon, where you will trade your bike for a kayak. Listen to a short safety briefing as you enjoy a refreshment; then select a life vest and partner-up for a kayak. A 25-minute kayaking adventure takes you along the perimeter of the western edge of the inner lagoon, close to a protected mangrove species that plays a vital role in habitat formation for all kinds of marine life. The intricate root structure of the mangroves allows juvenile fish to survive where predators can't reach them. The seafloor has turtle grass and a sandy bottom. Along the northwest quadrant of the lagoon, the rocky shoreline offers a vertical view as the limestone rocks reach more than 80 feet in height. This lagoon is an ecological wonder world with an area of 1,400 acres. Its extreme diversity boosts many species of marine life that mate and spawn within this habitat. Heading eastward along the shoreline and across to the southern coast close to Stingray Park, you'll finish your

paddle at Water Sport Center #3. Freshwater showers are available here and this is where you will board your tram for the five-minute ride back to the Welcome Center.

A Stroll through the Old Walled City

Continue to the **dungeons** (Las Bovedas), used as both military barracks and a munitions depot during colonial times. Today, local artisans display their art and handicrafts here, and you'll have 15 minutes to **shop** for souvenirs.

The visit to the bastions requires climbing a steep ramp. Tour includes extended periods of walking and standing in the Old Town.

Cartagena City Highlights

At Las Bovedas, you'll have about 20 minutes for **handicraft shopping** and for rubbing elbows with the local artisans who proudly display their works for you. Pass through Simón Bolívar Square and the Inquisition Palace before continuing on to the cathedral, also called the Minor Basilica. The cathedral was

built in honor of Santa Catalina de Alejandria and is the first church built in the city in 1537. It was destroyed in a fire in 1552 and again, while being rebuilt, by the cannons of the French privateer Baron Pointis. The cathedral's reconstruction finally came to pass in 1612. Next stop is the **Church of San Pedro Claver**—the patron saint of slaves. Continue to the modern residential area of Bocagrande, famous for its wide variety of shops. Here, you will find Colombia's famous native gem—the emerald—along with handicrafts and leather goods shops. You will have approximately 40 minutes to **shop** before returning to the ship.

This massive undertaking took more than 200 years to complete, and resulted in seven miles of walls surrounding the city, including Castillo de

San Felipe de Barajas (San Felipe Fortress), fortifications on every point and narrows, and the Fort of San Sebastián de Pastelillo. After your harbor cruise, you'll drive to the Pierino Gallo Shopping Center for a refreshment break and the opportunity to shop for Colombian emeralds, leather goods, coffee and souvenirs. Then, continue to Castillo de San Felipe de Barajas for a contrasting view from land and a guided tour of this formidable castle. Upon arrival at the magnificent fortress, you'll quickly see why Cartagena was the most impenetrable city of the Spanish Main. This 17th-century construction is the largest Spanish fort in the New World, representing the most important work of Spanish military engineering in South America. Your tour concludes with a walk back to your transportation, and a relaxing drive back to the pier.

La Popa Monastery, Gold Museum & Shopping

Departing from the pier, air-conditioned transportation brings you to the traditional residential district of Manga. Here you can admire the beautiful Republican-era houses en route to the **Convent of La Popa**. This 400 -year-old monastery is dedicated to Nuestra Señora de la Candelaria—one of the city's patron saints. Enjoy a splendid view of the walled city, the harbor, and the new town in the distance. Visit the small **chapel** for a look at the famous wooden statue of the Virgin of Candelaria. She is credited with delivering the city from the ravages of disease and pirates. The gold-leaf laminated main altar is also

worth seeing. Next, head to a photo stop at Castillo de San Felipe de Barajas, built in the 17th century and known as the finest example of Spanish military engineering in South America. The castle's mighty cannons made short work of the English ships whenever they ventured within range. Commander Edward Vernon lost more than 70 ships and 10,000 men in his ill-fated attempt to take the city. On a more cheery note, there's time for some handicraft shopping at Las Bovedas (the Dungeons). Learn about various battles and how the city defended itself from pirates on a brief visit to Santa Catalina's bastion, high atop the wall. At the Gold Museum, admire beautiful displays of valuable pre-Columbian gold artifacts. Some of the oldest ceramics in the Americas also reside here. In the modern residential area of Bocagrande, famous for its wide variety of shops, you will find Colombia's famous native gem—the emerald. Handicrafts and leather goods are also on display at the Pierino Gallo **Shopping Mall**. Browse or shop for approximately 45 minutes before returning to the ship.

Visit the former city dungeons at Las Bovedas, which have also been used as military barracks, a munitions depot and a jail, but today local artisans display their work there. You'll have between 15 to 20 minutes for shopping before returning to the ship.

Next, you will stop at Inquisition Palace, which served as a tribunal court and tried anyone the Church viewed as a heretic. The palace contains instruments of torture, along with documents, paintings and explanations about the Inquisition. You will see the small barred window from which the sentences handed down by the tribunal were announced to the public. Generally speaking, it wasn't good news.



However, the Crown Jewels of Persia (Iran) contain the most exquisite collection of fine emerald jewelry in the world. Continue your tour with a panoramic drive past the San Felipe Fortress and the Old Town en route to the Emerald Museum. Visit a **jewelry shop** where you can browse and shop for world-famous Colombian emeralds if you wish.

The National Aviary of Colombia

Travel by air-conditioned coach on a 40-minute ride to the island of Baru. Sit back and enjoy the scenery and view the growing industrial area around Cartagena. diversity, with more than 1,900 species, and the National Aviary reflects this with an important cross-section of this variety. Set out to explore the different bird observation stations arranged by habitat and species:

The Tropical Forest—macaws, Harpy eagles, tangaras and other species as well as different kinds of palms, waterfalls and macaque monkeys

Coastlines & Mangroves—the habitat of different kind of ducks, cormorants and pelicans

Coastline—herons, doves, storks and the migrating teals

The Desert Station—an environment where cardinals, mockingbirds and partridges live

The Andean Region—owls, eagles and the famous Andean condor—king of the mountains

Surrounded by birds, beautiful landscapes, palm trees and waterfalls, you will have time to enjoy a beverage or delicious Colombian coffee before the ride back to Cartagena.

Panama City consists of two parts. Part one is Panama Viejo (Old Panama), which lies in ruins after being sacked by the pirate Sir Henry Morgan and burned down in 1671. Part two is the Panama City of today, built in 1673 on a peninsula located that is just five miles from from the original settlement sacked by Morgan. Air-conditioned transportation will bring you to part one—the ruins of Old Panama. This site was founded in 1519 by the Spanish conquistador Pedro Arias de Ávila and played a major in one of the most important trade routes in the Americas. It was a repository for much of the gold and silver that Spain took from the New World. Walk with your guide through the ruins to learn about Old Panama's history and the lifestyle of its wealthy and important inhabitants. Next, you'll head to part two—the modern-day location of Panama City that boasts an incredible Old Town area known as the Casco Antiguo. The Casco Antiguo displays a fascinating mix of architectural styles, which in turn reflect the cultural diversity of the country. Caribbean, Republican, Art Deco, French and Colonial architecture mix in this historic area. Most of Panama City's main monuments are located in Casco Antiguo. During your second

walking tour of the day, you will see the Metropolitan Cathedral and the National Theater, among other buildings. Continue on to your final destination—Las Bóvedas. This is the sea wall of the Spanish Fort on the point of the peninsula and takes its name from the dungeons that are embedded in the wall. Fortunately, today the infamous dungeons are quite civilized and house an art gallery and a restaurant. A stroll along the top of the wall provides a unique view of Panama City across the bay. Survey Panama City, from old to new, from your coach on the way back to the ship.

Aerial Tram & Ecological Encounter to Colon

The aerial tram travels a half-mile through the canopy of the forest in about 45 minutes, not including time spent at the lookout. It takes you from the shadowy forest floor through the understory and into the sundrenched canopy. It is located in 247 acres of rain forest, surrounded by exuberant flora and fauna typical of Panama. Flora includes species such as the guarumo (trumpet tree), mangavillo, higo de Montaña, espave (wild cashew) and balsa. This impressive plant diversity is the food source for all kinds of indigenous animals including coatimundi, peccary, howler monkey, squires, capibarra

and sloth. Beautiful birds such as toucans, trogons, parrots, and momots are also plentiful. Reptiles and amphibians found in the Panamanian forests include caimans, iguanas, and dozens of species of frogs. Quite literally at the bottom of the food chain is the world of the insects, many of which are beautifully colored—butterflies, dragonflies, cicadas and others. Visit the **serpentarium** and observe a wide variety of poisonous and non-poisonous snakes. Resident reptile experts will teach you about the integral role these often misunderstood animals play in tropical ecology.

Authentic Embera Native Village to Colon

After **motoring** up-river, you will see the village emerge from the jungle. Keep your eyes open along the way, as the region offers abundant wildlife that is particularly active along the river's edge. In the village, the chief will welcome you with traditional Emberá hospitality. A series of **dances** have been arranged to add to this cultural exchange. Feel free to wander through the village, ask questions and interact with these quiet people. As you will be guests in their homes, a common sense approach and sensitivity to their privacy is appreciated. The Emberá men and woman are spectacular craftspeople and have produced some beautiful items available for purchase as souvenirs or keepsakes of this unique experience.

Your guide will offer details of the immense and profound history related to this spot. The Spaniards built the fort in the 16th century to defend the gold trail of the Spanish Main, and were very successful until the fort was finally sacked by the infamous Welsh Captain Henry Morgan. Next you will see the Path Between the Seas—the **Panama Canal**—and view the gargantuan ships that make their way through the Gatun Locks' chambers, where the ships seem to be a mere arm's length away. The Gatun Locks are the largest of the three sets of locks on the Panama Canal.

Frank Gehry Biomuseum & Old Canal Zone

Board an air-conditioned coach for a short transfer to the famous Frank Gehry-design Biomuseum. The **Biomuseum** tells the story of the physical rise of the Isthmus of Panama and how this cataclysmic event changed the natural world as we know it today. This museum is affiliated to the Smithsonian Institute, making Panama the first country outside of the US to have this type of affiliation. Through the Biomuseum, visitors discover the biodiversity value that Panama offers. Its objectives are to educate, create interchange of the natural and cultural resources of Panama, and focus knowledge regarding the environment and its conservation. Panama was chosen as the location of the Biomuseum due to its staggering biodiversity and its fascinating history. The museum recounts the rise of the Isthmus, including the biological and climatic changes that continue to transform the natural world. Spend approximately 90 minutes at the museum with an audio-guide to take you through the five different galleries. Afterwards, re-board your transportation and enjoy a panoramic drive through the former Canal Zone administered by the USA. You will see the Administration Building of the Panama Canal Authority, the former Balboa Area, the former Albrook Air Force Base and the home of the Southern Command-today known as the City of Knowledge. Your guide will explain all about this important and internationally recognized area.

Gatun Locks & Kayak in the Canal to Colon

Gatún Lake was created during the building of the Panama Canal because raising the water level across the isthmus meant that excavations did not have to be so vast. A large earthen wall was built, villages were flooded and the water rose to form Gatún Lake. At the Melia Resort, you will gear up, and away you go-paddling a kayak on the Panama Canal itself. You'll have approximately 1¾ hours to paddle among the islands of Gatún Lake. There are 1,368 species of vascular plants, 93 species of mammals and as many as 366 species of birds in this area. You will also visit the Gatún Locks Lookout where you will be able to see the operation of the canal—a great marvel of modern engineering.

Please note: Maximum weight is 250 lbs. Minimum age is 9 years. Double kayaks are used. This excursion will depart from Gatún Lake and will end in Colón where you will rejoin the ship. Gatun Locks & Panama Canal Expansion

Considered the eighth wonder of the world, the Panama Canal consists of a series of locks. Built between 1904 and 1914, this 48 mile-long international waterway extends across the Isthmus of Panama from Colón on the Atlantic Ocean side, to Balboa and the Pacific Ocean. This tour is designed to showcase the famed Gatún Locks and to offer an up-close look at how the canal is currently being expanded. To see the **Gatún Locks** in action and learn its history, you'll board an air-conditioned motor coach for a scenic ride through the lush rainforest and stunning scenery to the Gatún Locks. Your on-board guide will point out areas of interest along the way. Once you arrive at the Gatún Locks Visitor Center, you'll be amazed at how close you are to the ships. Here, you'll learn how ships navigating from the Pacific Ocean will first pass through two sets of locks—the Miraflores and the Pedro Miguel Locks. These locks place the vessel in Gatún Lake, which was once the largest man-made lake in the world. Then, the vessel crosses the lake to the Gatún Locks. Next, there are two parallel sets of locks that consist of three sub-locks that measure 984 feet long and 118 feet wide. This set of locks lifts ships a total of 85 feet into Bahía Limón and the Atlantic Ocean. After observing this amazing feat, you'll reboard your coach and travel to the Expansion **Observatory Platform** where you'll see the construction of a new traffic lane along the Panama Canal. This new lane will create two new sets of locks, one on the Pacific and one

on the Atlantic, which will double the canal's capacity and allow longer and wider vessels to transit. At the end of your excursion you'll return to port with a deeper understanding of the world's eighth wonder.

Miraflores Locks Observation Center to Colon

You'll visit exhibits that include historical objects related to the canal operations, interactive modules, video presentations, and models of the Panama Canal. Four exhibition halls, organized by themes, constitute the heart of the Miraflores Visitor Center. Hall One portrays the background, technological innovations, and sanitary initiatives that went hand in hand with the construction of the canal. Hall Two emphasizes the importance of water, conservation of the environment, protection of the canal watershed, the diversity of fauna and flora, and sustainable management. Hall Three depicts in an entertaining manner how the canal operates and offers a navigation simulator through one of the lock culverts. Hall Four provides information on the importance of the canal to world trade and identifies the main commodities and types of vessels that transit

the waterway. The return route will take you past the former Panama Canal Zone where the military installations of the American administration are a gentle reminder of the strategic importance of the area. Today the former PCZ is very much intact and is like a photographic image of what the days of the American Administration once were. Then, head back to the ship, filled with knowledge and history that will make your canal transit far more interesting.

The Best of Panama to Colon

Board a **motor launch** for a one-hour **cruise**. The lake is artificial and forms a major part of the Panama Canal passage, carrying ships during their transit across the Isthmus of Panama. The lake was created in 1907 by damming the Chagres River. Keep an eye out for monkeys, toucans, and sloths on the shoreline. After your cruise, you will have the unique opportunity to encounter the **Emberà Native** people. This tribe still lives in harmony with the natural surroundings in the rain forest. Witness traditional song and dance along with music performed on

handmade instruments. The Emberà possess an amazing botanical knowledge, and they are a warm and friendly people. After meeting the Emberà and enjoying their cultural performances, you will have a chance to purchase Native handicrafts from the villagers. Leaving the village, you will continue to the Gatún Locks observation area. Spend approximately one hour observing the law and operation. Your guide will explain the engineering feat required to move ships over the Continental Divide that separates two oceans. The Gatún Locks are the first set of locks, situated at the Atlantic entrance of the Panama Canal. A series of three lock chambers raise ships to 87 feet above sea level. Each lock is 100 feet wide and 1,000 feet long and takes 8 - 15 minutes to fill with water. Ships are raised a total of 87 feet above sea level into Gatun Lake, then lowered at the end of their transit into the other ocean. A common misconception is that one ocean is higher than the other but, of course, they are both at sea level. After witnessing the locks in action, board your transportation for the drive back to the ship.

The Canal Experience to Colon

Next you will enter the Pedro Miguel Locks and Miraflores Lake. On the far side of the lake you will find the Miraflores Locks—your passage to the Pacific Ocean. Watch for the Centennial and Americas Bridges and you will end your adventure at the Pacific port at the entrance to the Panama Canal. A motor coach will transport you back to the ship.

Please note: Tour duration varies. Canal transits are scheduled and controlled by the Panama Canal Authority. This excursion will depart from Gatun Lake and will be completed in Colon, where guests will rejoin the ship. There are no wheelchair accessible restrooms on the ferry.

The Shaping of Panama to Colon

Traverse the **Trans-Isthmus Highway** from the **Atlantic to the Pacific**—the same route once used by the Spanish Conquistadors and the Forty-Niners seeking a short cut from the east to the gold fields in California. Panama is

a country whose name is utterly inseparable from the image of the canal that changed the world—considered by many to be the Eighth Wonder of the World. Yet the "other" Panama is just as interesting, with an amazing history of glory and tragedy that has shaped this country that was once known as the Pearl of the Pacific. A 90-minute drive from Gatún brings you to Fort Amador, where you will have some free time to shop for items from all over Panama. Continue through the streets of the old French Quarter of Panama City, founded in 1673 by French Colónists. You'll hear tales of the extraordinary gallantry and shocking piracy that kept the inhabitants in a state of constant high alert in Colonial Panama, known as Casco Antiguo. On a leisurely 45-minute guided walk, appreciate the unique architecture, influenced by a wonderful blend of French, Spanish and Italian styles. After a buffet lunch, re-board you motor coach for the drive to Old Panama, which was founded in 1519 and destroyed by the infamous Welsh Captain Henry Morgan in 1671. You will see the ruins of the churches and convents, colonial palaces, bridges and military buildings that attest to the grandiose past of this country.

Please note: Photos of the National Theatre, the cathedral and the Church of the Golden Altar (left intact by Morgan when he sacked Panama City) can be taken from the coach. The total driving time is approximately four hours. Approximate walking will be 1,000 yards. There may be a delay for the vehicles at the end of the visit to the French Plaza. The gardens cover approximately ten acres and include many types of plant groups—palms, heleconias, bromeliads, calatheas, aroids and others. A special Talamanca area features indigenous plants. There are also spices—vanilla, black pepper, cinnamon—for an aromatic experience. Fruit such as papaya, banana, cacao and pineapple grow here as well. Don't miss the amazing 'miracle fruit'. Your challenge for the day? To figure out why it is called miraculous!

Caribbean Train, Eco Cruise & Countryside

Board a historic, recently restored car of the open-air train that has facilitated Costa Rica's banana industry for decades. The rail line passes through incredible landscapes showcasing Costa Rica's storied Caribbean region. The next part of the tour will take you by boat into the Tortuguero Canals where waterfowl, whiteface and spider monkeys, and many other animals are easily spotted. Fresh fruit and ice-cold water are served at the take-out point. Upon returning to Moin's private station, continue your journey by bus through banana plantations. You can take photos from the bus as you learn about this important crop.

Departing from the pier of Puerto Limón, you'll drive south past Cieneguita—the oldest part of Limón. The province of Limón covers an area of 3,583 square miles with a population of 432,000 people. Many are black descendants from Jamaica, originally brought here by Minor C. Keith to build the railroad that proved almost impossible. Many of those Jamaicans stayed in the area after completion of the railroad to work on the cacao and banana plantations. Their houses were built on stilts, as the conditions of coastal swamps, landslides, flooding, jungle fevers and heavy rains made for hard-won battles. Continuing your journey, you will pass Limón International Airport, banana and cacao plantations, and beautiful vistas of the Caribbean Sea from a coastline adorned with palm trees. Keep an eye out as you may spot white egrets, blue herons, kingfishers, pelicans, iguanas, flycatchers, roadside hawks and black-shouldered kites. During the tour, you will be able to visit a banana-processing plant to see how bananas are selected, cleaned and packed for export. After your visit to the banana plantation, you'll stop briefly at Bananito Village, where you can purchase local **souvenirs** to take home.

Rain Forest Aerial Tram

If walking through a rain forest seems exciting, then brace yourself for the experience of traveling on top of it in the central mountains of Costa Rica. The Rain Forest Aerial Tram is a unique eco-tourism adventure sightseeing experience.
